The Association of Anatomical Pathology Technology (AAPT) was formed in 2003.

Members of the AAPT are predominantly employed as Anatomical Pathology Technologists (APTs) in both hospital and public mortuaries: but we also welcome Mortuary Assistants, medical staff and other healthcare scientists.

The AAPT is committed to working with the appropriate authorities & organisations to help ensure, and improve, the professional, educational and practical standards for technologists across the United Kingdom and beyond.

Through the development of qualifications and best practice literature, the AAPT can set standards to ensure the dignity of deceased patients and relatives.

Code of Conduct

Members of the AAPT adhere to a professional Code of Conduct. They must:

- Uphold the dignity and reputation of the Association by applying the highest standards of conduct, honesty and integrity in their personal and professional behaviour
- Exercise their professional practice and skill, within the agreed and known limits of their professional knowledge with judgement and responsibility
- Maintain, develop and keep up to date their professional competence and skills.
- Observe the legal and ethical framework appropriate to their current and future roles
- Recognise the beliefs and values of the wider general public, the users of the service and professional colleagues, treating them on a fair and equitable basis
- Ensure their own beliefs and values do not prejudice or compromise their ability to carry out their professional roles and duties.
- Educate professional peers, colleagues and the wider general public about anatomical pathology technology and its practice
- Promote the study and activity of anatomical pathology by promotion of the values, aims and objectives of the Association of Anatomical Pathology Technology.

Influence

The Department of Health has approached the AAPT to comment on every major consultation document relating to death, bereavement, post mortem consent and emergency planning. The AAPT also has strong professional representation links with:

- Academy for Healthcare Science
- Science Council
- Home Office
- and many other relevant stakeholders

This two-way communication with national organisations and government departments has given technologists a voice that had previously been unheard in the corridors of power.

Events

The major event of each year is the Annual Conference. This informative meeting provides a stimulating lecture programme with renowned speakers. It also allows the opportunity to socialise with other delegates and network with commercial partners. One day practical workshops on the taking of consent have been held in liaison with the Human Tissue Authority, the AAPT are also happy to bring such training locally into your workplace.

A growing regional network across the UK is allowing technologists to share knowledge at a local level. Groups have already been formed in London & the South East, the South West and Scotland.

CPD & Website

The AAPT website is an excellent resource tool for technologists, healthcare science colleagues and for those wishing to pursue a career as an APT. The site has a domain that is for members only, including a popular forum for the swapping of general and technical information and opinion. There is also a Facebook group for members only and a Twitter feed @AAPTTweets

A Learning Zone area features on-line learning known as Read, Test & Reflect (RTR), whereby members can test their knowledge on the most up-to-date articles and guideline documents relating to anatomical pathology technology.

It is the personal duty of any professional to keep their knowledge and skills up to date so that they remain competent to practise. The AAPT CPD scheme encourages APT staff to maintain, improve and extend their knowledge, skills and practice.

The Members Area also now includes an on-line CPD recording portfolio, with the ability to reflect upon each and every activity undertaken.

The scheme is a free to all members of the Association regardless of grade. For members who achieve a high standard of CPD activity, a special Award Certificate will be presented.

AAPT believe APTs should be regulated

The AAPT has been in regular communication with the Department of Health and other stakeholders and a path emerged for Anatomical Pathology Technologists to achieve statutory regulation.

Regulation via registration is extremely important as a tool for ensuring that the public receive excellent services provided by professionals who are held accountable for their actions. In this way the sole aim of any registration process is to provide protection for the public.

On September 1st the successful migration of voluntary registers from the Voluntary Registration Council (VRC) to the Academy for Healthcare Science (AHCS) took place.

To date there are 70+ APT's on the voluntary register held by the Academy of Healthcare Science.

The AAPT is also a Member Body of the Science Council and will be seeking to award Chartered Scientist, Registered Scientist and Registered Science Technician depending on job role, qualification and experience as an APT.

Becoming a Member

The membership grades are as follows and you must join at the grade that matches your job, qualifications and experience:

• Fellow

A Fellow of the AAPT will hold, as a minimum qualification, the RSPH Diploma or Level 4 Diploma **and** have four year's post qualification experience. The fee is £50 per annum, with the AAPT subscription running from 1st April to 31st March each year (half price from 1st September)

Member

A Member of the AAPT will hold, as a minimum qualification, the RSPH Certificate or Level 3 Diploma in Anatomical Pathology Technology. This grade will also apply to those who have obtained the RSPH Diploma, but have less than four year's post-qualification experience. The fee is $\pounds40$ per annum with the AAPT subscription running from 1st April to 31st March each year (half price from 1st September)

Student

A Student member of the AAPT will be employed in a hospital or public mortuary as a trainee APT. The fee is £25 per annum with the AAPT subscription running from 1st April to 31st March each year (half price from 1st September)

Offer: Students on their first year of the Level 3 Diploma in Anatomical Pathology Technology can join for $\pounds10.00$ in that year

Associate

An Associate member of the AAPT will be working as a Mortuary Assistant or equivalent. The fee is $\pounds 25$ per annum with the AAPT subscription running from 1st April to 31st March each year (half price from 1st September)

• Affiliate

The grade of Affiliate is open to biomedical scientists, embalmers, pathologists, bereavement officers and other

healthcare science professionals who wish to be affiliated to the AAPT. The fee is £50 per annum, with the AAPT subscription running from 1st April to 31st March each year (half price from 1st September)

RSPH Level 3 Diploma Anatomical Pathology Technology – External Assessment

AAPT are always looking for keen Certificate & Diploma qualified APTs to train to become external assessors for the assessment of practical mortuary skills required by the RSPH Level 3 Diploma students.

External assessors are integral and invaluable to the process of seeing trainee APTs qualify to APT level.

Please note you do not need to be a mortuary manager / senior APT to be an external assessor, you just need to fit the criteria and be in a position to offer a commitment of 1 or 2 days per year to visit trainees to complete assessment in their workplace. You will also need excellent verbal and written communication skills to ensure completion of the associated RSPH assessment report documentation.
